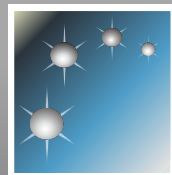

Cost Includes:

- ♦ Airfare from Tampa to Miami to San Pedro Sula and return.
- ♦ Ground transportation in Honduras to and from San Pedro Sula airport and as needed for the group in El Progreso each day.
- ♦ Ministries in Mission – Accident Travel Insurance.
- ♦ Seven nights in hotel.
- ♦ **Breakfast** six or seven mornings depending on returning flight times.
- ♦ Light **lunch** provided by participating churches Tuesday through Saturday.
- ♦ Complimentary tote bag to carry witnessing material to homes.
- ♦ All necessary witnessing materials: 100 Questionnaire Sheets, 60 Testimony sheets, 1 Questionnaire and 1 Testimony sheet laminated for your use, 50 Decision Cards, 8 Report Cards, 132 Bookmarks, 50 Tracts, 1 parallel Spanish/English New Testament.
- ♦ Team Member part of setup costs in order to conduct the STAR Team 2006 Campaign.

Cost Does **NOT** Include:

Bible Basics International is responsible to provide only the things listed in the left column for the member cost quoted. **All other expense, including but not limited to the following items, must be paid by each individual team member.**

- ♦ Passport cost not included. (No visa needed for US citizens. **Be sure you have a valid passport or you will lose your investment!**)
- ♦ Any necessary vaccinations not included.
- ♦ Your cost of getting from home to Tampa and from Tampa back home or additional air fare from an embarkation point other than Tampa not included.
- ♦ **Evening meal** each day not included. (Take a minimum of \$100 per person for evening meals, souvenirs, etc.)
- ♦ Medical Bills resulting from sickness, accident, or any other reason not included.
- ♦ Medicines of all kinds, Malaria pills, Imodium, any other medicines you take not included.
- ♦ Souvenirs, film, phone calls, e-mails, and other personal items not included.

Financial:

1. Send \$100 with the application,
2. **Send ½ of the total cost three months in advance** of the trip (including the above \$100)
3. **Send the entire amount 45 days before the trip** before nonrefundable airline reservations are made. **Once reservations are made in your name, money is NOT refundable.**

If you must opt out before #2 is sent above, your \$100 will be refunded. However, the airline group discount rates depend on a minimum number going on the trip. Therefore, please try to keep your commitment to go or else opt out as early as possible. Thank you.

Application Requirements For El Progreso, Honduras

Letter of Recommendation:

A letter of recommendation must be obtained from your pastor stating that you are a member in good standing, and a person he can personally recommend for an overseas witness team. This requirement is waived for those who have been on previous STAR Team trips with BBI and those whom we know personally.

Agreement with BBI's Doctrinal Statement

See the folder entitled "Team Member Information" for the Statement.

Valid Passport:

Valid for at least three months beyond the anticipated return trip of the Team to the USA.

Your Signed Release of Liability:

We will provide you with an "Adult Release of Liability" form for you to sign. See the folder entitled "Team Member Information" for the wording of the form that will be sent to you.

Age:

Each STAR Team member must be 18 years old or older.

Personal Testimony:

If you are accepted as a STAR Team member, you will be asked for a short written personal testimony that can be translated into Spanish. It is used in connection with your witness opportunities. It should be no longer than will fit on one side of a 5 ½ X 8 ½ sheet of paper, typewritten. If you would like to include that with the application, you may do so.

Member Preparation For El Progreso, Honduras

Recommended Immunizations:

If your immunizations are out of date, you may get them either at the Public Health Department or your local doctor's office if available:

- ◆ Diphtheria/tetanus up-to-date (OK if you had them within the last 10 years.)
- ◆ Typhoid shot
- ◆ Hepatitis A (2 doses)
- ◆ Hepatitis B (3 shots – two before you leave and one when you return.)

Some County Health Departments do not give these particular immunizations. Call your health department to find out.

For Tampa Bay Area: Pinellas County Health Department did give the immunizations in 2005. It is located at 310 N. Myrtle Ave., Clearwater, FL. Hours: 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Phone 469-5800 to verify. You may also try Holiday, Pasco, and Hillsborough Country Health Departments.

Airline Permitted Luggage:

Carry-on: 1 bag 45 in 40 lbs
Checked: 2 bags 62 in. each 50 lbs
(\$25 USD charge each for bags weighing 51-70 lbs.)

For size add the total outside dimensions, that is, length + width + height.

Take with You To El Progreso, Honduras

Sunscreen (48 strength)

Sunglasses

A hat (sun is hot)

Hand sanitizers – Purell - use before eating and other appropriate times. Ask team leader.

A sufficient supply of the various medications you normally take.

Malaria pills (Get a doctor's prescription for malaria pills - Chloric. Ask your doctor when to begin and finish taking them.)

Imodium (Effective for normal diarrhea – some diarrhea requires seeing the Team doctor doing AIDS lectures if necessary.)

Long-sleeved shirts, for wear especially in the evening when mosquitoes are out.

Deet (mosquito repellent) Rub on and spray at night and before you go out in daytime.

Camera (and film if not a digital camera)

Small gifts for the pastor and for your translators with whom you work.

Personal cash for spending on souvenirs, personal items, and one meal per day.

One or two wash clothes if you use them. Hotels furnish towels, not wash clothes.

Some toilet paper or small packages of Kleenex. Toilet covers are available in small pocket packages of five at Wal-Mart.

Ladies: Modest or long skirts or dresses (no shorts, pants, or jeans).

A few extra clothes hangers

Personal snacks for traveling

Comfortable walking shoes

Small umbrella

Your personal Bible

After Arriving In El Progreso, Honduras

Do Not:

Do not pet animals

Do not take ice in drinks unless you know for sure it is made from purified water.

Do not brush your teeth with the tap water; use bottled water to brush, rinse, and clean toothbrush.

Do not eat salad, fresh fruits, or vegetables unless in one of the chain restaurants: Burger King, Pizza Hut, etc.

Ladies, you may not want to carry a purse. Take a smaller one on the trip and leave it at base. You will be carrying a small tote bag of materials to use in visitations.

Do not make phone calls from the hotel (very expensive), use an Internet Cafe instead.

Do:

Drink **only** purified bottled water or sodas (Pepsi, Coca-Cola, etc.)

Carry a bottle of drinking water with you. (One furnished each morning at hotel.)

Hotel Casa Blanca

Our advance STAR Team stayed several nights in the hotel in February. It is a local Honduran hotel, air conditioned, clean, and comfortable. Warm to hot water in the shower, no hot water in the basin. There is a beautiful interior garden and a swimming pool!

We enjoyed breakfast of eggs, pancakes or toast, coffee, and juice. Cereal is also available. A fresh bottle of drinking water will be furnished each morning to take with you.
